Inspiring Mathematicians With Project-Based Learning

Surface Area Castle Project

At St. Nicholas, the Jr. High math team created a collaborative and interactive project to inspire the students to better understand surface area and volume. Standards from technology, 7th, 8th, Algebra, and Geometry were all taken into consideration when the teachers developed this Castle mini-unit. The 8th graders worked together to create specific shapes to build a castle as they were tasked to find the surface area and volume of each shape they used. Some of the geometry students applied their trigonometry lessons to find and prove the area formulas for hexagonal and pentagonal pyramids. In the end, all were able to calculate a total surface area and volume along with showcasing their finished product to the school.






Starbucks Day In 2nd Grade

Our 2nd grade classroom turned into a Barista Learning Lab. The joys of learning real-life math in a creative learning environment. As parents, faculty, and our pastor came through to purchase a cup of coffee, students scurried about to demonstrate excellent customer service, and to add up all the items purchased. The use of fake money did not affect the seriousness of their work in determining the proper change.



Fraction Cooking In 5th Grade

The fraction cooking project allowed students to apply their learning of multiplying and dividing with fractions. They were asked to bring in a recipe and then increase or decrease serving sizes to show how the quantity of each ingredient is affected. This hands-on project allowed for great partner work and incorporated applied measurement. Students were asked to make a version of their recipe with their partner which required measuring ingredients Students worked in pairs to do a calculation page showing their work and then created a poster that illustrated what they made, including pictures of them making the recipe together.

Encountering Impactful Retreats

Retreats help students step out of the classroom and into a space where they can encounter their classmates and teachers in a new setting, and be challenged to open their hearts, minds, and souls to how God is working through them.

Retreats can be turning points for certain students to see a classmate in a new way or to experience one's vulnerability and kinship with each other.

Students experience ample opportunities to explore their team-building skills.

The administration, pastor, priests, parish staff, and all junior high faculty play a role in planning and executing the retreats. Students feel the connectedness of all the adults helping in their formation as they build a deeper relationship with each other and God.







Poetry Celebration at St. Nicholas

Several years back we decided to take a fresh look at how we were embracing poetry and inspiring young poets. Teachers worked together to explore the many different genres of poetry and determined a plan for instruction and celebration. All students study the basic structure, theme, and cadence of poetry but in older grades more complex structures are explored such as Ode, Elegy, Ballad and Sonnet. Once created, students are asked to share their poems in various ways.

- At morning assembly buddy classes paired up and recited poems before the audience.
- Students published and shared poems for their classmates and parents to enjoy.
- In the springtime, we held a Poetry Celebration day where chosen students recited their original works before the school community.

A kick start of motivation, when you and I meet.

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





Gift Of Stock

When you decide to give a gift of appreciated securities directly to St. Nicholas School rather than selling them and donating the proceeds, you could be creating a dual tax advantage for yourself. The full fair market value of the stock is tax deductible in the year you give the gift (stock owned for more than one year). You pay no capital gains tax on your profit no matter how much the securities have increased in value. The value of your stocks for income tax purposes will be set by the value of the stocks on the day that your gift is made. On actively traded securities, the value is the mean or average between the highest and lowest quoted sales price on the day of your gift.




